Duty to Report

Confidentiality is essential to the trust of a group, but confidentiality can also cause harm. As a church, we have a moral and legal obligation to report certain things if we become aware of them:

If there is any indication that a minor (child or youth) is at risk of abuse or neglect, or if there is intimate partner violence in a home with a child or youth:

- If there is immediate danger, call 911
- If the danger is not immediate, call the Ministry for Children and Family Development (1-800-663-9122)

If there is any indication that a vulnerable adult (someone with limited mental ability, dementia, or the elderly) is at risk of abuse or neglect:

- If there is immediate danger, call 911
- If the danger is not immediate, contact:
 - For seniors, call The Seniors Abuse and Information Line (1-866-437-1940)
 - o For those in assisted living, call The Assisted Living Registrar (1 866 714-3378)
 - For family and sexual violence, call Victim Link BC (1-800-563-0808)

If someone intends to harm themselves through suicide:

Get the person to the Emergency Room of a hospital. Otherwise, call 911.

If someone intends to harm another person:

If the danger is immediate, call 911

If we need help navigating whether or not to report:

Reach out to a pastor at your campus and they can help walk with you.
